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PROTECTING YOUR CHILD - SAFEGUARDING & KEEPING SAFE AND HEALTHY

Internet Safety <u>Click here</u> to visit the UK Safer Internet Centre. This contains lots of useful information to help you to ensure that your children remain safe online.

The most important things to remember are that:

- children seem to have a natural attraction to and ability with technology, so they want to use it as much as they can
- they have no real concept of risk, and to them the whole world is an exciting place perhaps thankfully, they do not understand that there are some really nasty people out
 there who will tell lies to them on line and do them harm, so it is up to us to worry
 about that for them
- make sure your children use any digital media devices where you can see them ie supervise them using the internet highway as you would them using a physical road
- check the browsing history on any devices
- control is lost on anything uploaded once it is posted it can be used by anyone

Remember that open replies to Facebook posts are public and can be read by anyone so use a direct message instead.

Hand washing: Help us to limit the spread of infection by washing your hands, and supervising your children to wash theirs, just before and after coming to playgroup or school. We practice lots of hand washing with the children while they are here as well!

Exclusion times: If your child has sickness or diarrhea, please keep them at home until at least 48 hours clear from the last 'episode'. If they have a specific illness, such as hand, foot and mouth disease, please check with us for the period of time they have to stay away - we have a whole list from the Health Protection Agency. Although we are able to administer prescribed medication if your child is otherwise well enough to come in, we do not administer any over the counter medication (including Calpol). In general (exceptions being issues such as injuries), if your child needs to take Calpol to bring their temperature down or otherwise appear well enough to come to Playgroup, they should in fact be at home.

Glue ear: This is a prime time of year for children to develop glue ear, following colds or other viral infections; roughly 1 in 5 pre-school children have glue ear at any one time! Symptoms include changes in behaviour and sleeping patterns, to becoming more tired and easily distracted, asking to turn up the volume or them shouting themselves. If you are concerned do speak to your Health Visitor or GP - although it may sort itself out, glue ear may require further intervention. A top tip to help is to encourage your children to learn to blow their noses, rather than sniff or wipe them.
